While Jesus was in Jerusalem for the Passover Festival, many believed in his name because they saw the miraculous signs that he did. But Jesus didn't trust himself to them because he knew all people. He didn't need anyone to tell him about human nature, for he knew what human nature was.

-John 2. 23- 25 (CEB)

One of my favorite parts about reading the Bible is how often something appears new to me. A few days ago, I was reading the Common English Bible on the elliptical and came across this verse. While I am sure I have read it in the past, it struck me anew. Perhaps it is my Lenten mind that is thinking of the faults and failures of people (especially my own). I had never really thought of the fact that Jesus fully understands human nature. He did not need a class in psychology. He did not need to do research. Instead, Jesus, being both fully human and fully divine, understood far greater than people what their nature was.

First, human nature is very temperamental. Notice this passage begins with many people believed because of the signs he did. In other words, Jesus did miracles, people were amazed and people desired to "follow" him. Jesus knew that in a few short years, this crowd that would follow him amazed by His miracles would forsake Him at the

cross. What kind of testimony would that be about Him. No, Jesus could not trust himself to these people, because they were yet unredeemed. Their "faith" was not in His actual presence or words, but their "faith" was in the miracles that He performed. As long as Jesus kept performing, they would keep following. Jesus was not about to entrust His testimony with such fickle people.

The next scene brings great light to the situation. Nicodemus, a teacher of the law, comes to talk to Jesus. This is where Jesus will tell him that you must be born again (John 3. 3). This baffles Nicodemus. Nicodemus was so focused on human realities that he could not comprehend what Jesus was referring to. Jesus understood that the key to faith is denying our human nature and being born anew with the Holy Spirit. This contrast is striking. Jesus does not want the testimony of those who simply stood in awe of the miracles. He wants the testimony of lives that have been born anew into His presence. Jesus did not come into the world to perform. Jesus came into the world that we could be transformed and inherit everlasting life(John 3. 16).

Lent is a great time to remind ourselves that we need to deny our earthly natures daily and take up our crosses and follow Christ (Luke 9. 23). The real miracle of faith is that God changes hearts and minds. Jesus does not want followers who simply want to be in awe of performances. Jesus wants followers who have committed their lives to being renewed by Him! This is why Paul reminds us that we need to be transformed by the renewing of our minds (Romans 12.2). Faith is not about empowering our earthly nature, it is about casting it off and embracing our new nature in Christ. It is only then that we can testify about Jesus. Let us testify about His transforming grace this Lenten season comes to a close!
