

It was still the first day of the week. That evening, while the disciples were behind closed doors because they were afraid of the Jewish authorities, Jesus came and stood among them. He said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. When the disciples saw the Lord, they were filled with joy. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father sent me, so I am sending you." Then he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive anyone's sins, they are forgiven; if you don't forgive them, they aren't forgiven."



-John 20. 19-23

It is common for people to believe that there is a Creator who made everything that we see. Most people will concur with the idea that the universe is not simply happenstance. This concept of God might make people ponder His vastness and wonder about His properties, but it falls painfully short of the wonders of the God we serve. We serve a God who revealed Himself in the fullness of the Trinity. We serve a God who did not simply create and leave us to our own devices. He did not allow us to wallow in our own faults and failures, but instead He came down as a human to deliver us from the power of sin. Our God created and redeemed! But there is one other aspect that we must not lose sight of- our God sustains us as well! He did not leave us here to be orphaned or abandoned, but He sent His Holy Spirit to guide and direct us. We cannot lose sight of the power of this wonder!

As a parent, there are times when we see our children struggling and we wish we could just make their decisions for them. We can feel helpless as we see our children suffer emotional and sometimes physical harm by persisting in poor decisions. If we could, we would enter into their minds and guide them down better paths. The amazing thing is our heavenly Father has made this offer! The Holy Spirit was sent to guide and lead us down the paths God would have us walk if we would only receive Him! Yet, we still frequently wallow in our own choices, paying the consequences and complaining to God about why He didn't protect us. The real issue is why didn't we seek Him first! I used to work with a man who would always ask me why God doesn't like him because life was so hard. After numerous conversations, I finally asked if he ever included God in the decision process. When he answered no, I blurted out (not so pastorally a thing to do), then how can you blame Him? If we do not allow God's presence to guide our every decision and thought, then we cannot fault God for the outcome.

In the gospel of John, Jesus promises the Holy Spirit in chapter 14 and delivers that promise in chapter 20. The promise is fundamental because it completes the work of the Trinity in the disciple's lives. The Father created, the Son redeemed and the Spirit sustains. However, this isn't just a simple sustenance. It is one of power and authority. This power and authority is so pervasive that the disciples are even given the power to forgive sins! Why would we have that power? Because if the Spirit is God's presence within us, then we have that capability as God's children and joint heirs with Jesus Christ (Romans 8). It is with the gift of the Holy Spirit that I think Jesus' promise of abundant life (John 10. 10) comes to fruition. We no longer need to trust in our own understanding. We no longer need to be held down by our inadequacies or past histories. Instead, we have been set free by the Holy Presence of God in order to faithfully serve Him- if only we willingly receive this gift that He so freely offers! May we receive this gift together as Ono UMC moves into the future as God's presence in the Northern Lebanon community.


