"Happy are people who grieve, because they will be made glad.


"Happy are people who are humble, because they will inherit the earth.

I hear a lot of people desire the Ten Commandments be posted publicly. I would prefer the beatitudes. The beatitudes begin Jesus' longest recorded sermon. They are shocking. They are countercultural. They are clearly expectations that Jesus has in order for us to be salt and light (Matthew 5. 13-16). They are clearly expectations for people so that they will be blessed (the CEB uses the word happy) and so that our good works would point to God. Two-thousand years later, they are still shockingly counter-cultural. They are frequently ignored or at least downplayed in expectations of the people of God. This summer, we will be using these to monitor our faith and hearts before God.

The beatitudes depend on the concept of "blessed." In modern society, we usually use the term to refer to material blessings. People talk about their new house, cars, jobs, etc. and say they are blessed. When a loved one recovers from an illness or is relieved of harm, we say we are blessed. The beatitudes challenge that assessment and lend to the idea that blessedness comes from our relationship with God. We are not blessed by material- we are blessed by a heavenly Father whose thoughts are not our thoughts and ways are not our ways (Isaiah 55. 8). I prefer to think about blessed as the joy that comes from God and is unshakeable by earthly circumstances. With the Holy Spirit leading us, we are blessed!

I believe that each one of these beatitudes should help us ensure that the Holy Spirit has hold of our lives. We will use the beatitudes to keep "tab" of our faith. Each one should help guide our thoughts that should guide our attitudes that should guide our behaviors. We will go over each of these simple, challenging statements to keep a check on our responses to God. May God's Spirit move mightily in our presence as we seek to grow deeper in our response to His grace. May we be truly blessed so that we can be salt and light to Northern Lebanon! May the world see our good works and bring glory to our heavenly Father who lives and reigns forever!




Newsletter – Youth June 2020

In the 1950s, when it seemed certain that Alaska would be admitted to the Union, designers began retooling the American flag to add a 49th star to the existing 48. Meanwhile, a 17-year-old Ohioan named Bob Heft student borrowed his mother's sewing machine, disassembled his family's 48-star flag and stitched on 50 stars in a proportional pattern. He handed in his creation to his history teacher for a class project, explaining that he expected Hawaii would soon achieve statehood as well. Heft also sent the flag to his congressman, Walter Moeller, who presented it to President Eisenhower after both new states joined the Union. Eisenhower selected Heft's design, and on July 4, 1960, the president and the high school student stood together as the 50-star flag was raised for the first time. Heft's teacher promptly changed his grade from a B- to an A.

For He will lead the way!


No mask will keep us quiet
