
Good News in Ono

Finally, be strengthened by the Lord and his powerful strength. Put on God's armor so that you can make a stand against the tricks of the devil. We aren't fighting against human enemies but against rulers, authorities, forces of cosmic darkness, and spiritual powers of evil in the heavens. Therefore, pick up the full armor of God so that you can stand your ground on the evil day and after you have done everything possible to still stand. So stand



with the belt of truth around your waist, justice as your breastplate, and put shoes on your feet so that you are ready to spread the good news of peace. Above all, carry the shield of faith so that you can extinguish the flaming arrows of the evil one. Take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is God's word.

Offer prayers and petitions in the Spirit all the time. Stay alert by hanging in there and praying for all believers. As for me, pray that when I open my mouth, I'll get a message that confidently makes this secret plan of the gospel known.

-Ephesians 6. 10-19 (CEB)

I find it so easy to become distracted by this current world. I check my retirement account balances, shake my head at news, ponder how different society is today than 20 years ago then read about how to deal with it all. It is so easy to think answers are found by experts and if we simply implement their advice, then life will be perfect! We will have the right body, great relationships, perfect children, solid finances, so on and so on. Eventually, one thing becomes clear- if the advice was that solid, then we would all be living great lives! Unfortunately (or maybe fortunately), it is not that simple.

We get distracted by these things because they are tangible. We see them. We touch them. We experience them. Paul reminds the ekklessia in Ephesus that our battle is not of this world. Believing that the battle is here simply plays into the hands of the evil one. Our focus blocks us from seeing the one thing we need to- God's presence in our lives! While we might experience a physical battle, we are in a spiritual battle. If we want genuine victory, then we cannot win by fighting the wrong battle. This is a simple concept to understand and explain, but a complex one to actually live.

The ekklessia has forgot how to "fight." We have used the words tactics and techniques and wonder why we are losing ground to secularism. In our next sermon series, we will hopefully be learning about how to effectively fight the good fight of faith (1 Timothy 6. 12). We will base the idea predominately on the armor of God as the vital "weapons" we need to employ in order to stand up to the evil one and empower God's army in our lives. My hope and prayer is that when we are finished, you will feel more equipped to handle the challenges in life. It is not a promise that life will be easy- it is a promise that God will be with and for us if we empower His presence in our battle. I recently heard a man say something along the lines of when the work load of life gets hard, he doesn't ask God for a lighter load, he asks for a stronger back. May God strengthen our hearts, minds and souls so that we may put on the whole armor of God and see the glory of His power and might at work in our lives.



Happy Fall y'all! I love this time of year for watching the leaves change and the smell of crisp fall air – but if I am honest, the short days cause me to struggle...I love sunshine!!! As seasons change it is always a good time to take a survey of yourself and do what I call a "heart check". Where is God doing a work in your life? What opportunities

has God given you to serve others? Where can you plug in to grow your faith? Is your relationship with Jesus making a difference in your life?

This September our teens went through a study called "You can't Quarantine the Gospel!" During our time together we were challenged in 3 areas – **Prayer, Care and Share**. Each of us were asked to think of 3 people in our lives who need Jesus. The first week all we did was pray for them – (sounds simple but takes real commitment to be faithful in prayer!) The second week we were asked to find ways to care for them – send them an



encouraging message, have dinner with them, hang out with them – all the while continuing to pray for them. And lastly our challenge was to share our faith with them. If these three people in our lives are so important to us, then why wouldn't we share our faith with them?



We want to extend this challenge to you as well...surely all of us have 3 people we know and love who don't know Jesus or who have drifted away from Him. This is the command of the gospel – not a recommendation or suggestion - Go and make disciples. May we all have the courage and boldness to share the Good news in this new month ahead! *Jess Grimes*
