Update on the May 25 Church Congregational Vote

On Tuesday, May 25, at a special meeting for all Ono Church members, the decision was made to approve the following motion that had been approved and recommended by Ad Council:

Motion to purchase the property at 74 McGillstown Road, Annville, PA 17003 from Ken and Kim Moyer at the price of \$195,000. The church would pay \$70,000 as a down payment (\$20,000 from building, \$50,000 from CD) and closing costs from the CD to secure a \$125,000 mortgage. The church conference (congregational vote) must pass with a minimum of 2/3 approval from members present.

Once the church assumes ownership, the plan is to have the house rented out to tenants like the 17 Main Street church property rental house.

Thank you to all who have been in prayer for this decision and for those who were able to attend the meeting on May 25. Keep praying for God's direction in the months and years to come for how best we can use this new purchase toward our mission of being salt and light to the community of Ono. ~Eric Wentling, Lay Leader
