## **Good News in Ono**

Jesus said to him, "Your repentance shows that today life has come to you and your household, and that you are a true son of Abraham. The Son of Man has come to seek out and to give life to those who are lost."

-Luke 19. 9- 10 (TPT)

The story of Jesus and Zacchaeus teaches us some very valuable lessons. First, Jesus pursues us. Jesus did not simply set up a synagogue somewhere and expect people to come find Him. Instead, Jesus went through the towns, into the wilderness, wherever He needed to go in order to engage people with His presence. His presence was so powerful that people actively sought Him out and crowds seemed to form wherever He went. Even in those crowds, Jesus knows people's hearts and He pursues those who need Him. He could have simply walked by Zacchaeus and anticipated that Zacchaeus would listen and learn from afar. Jesus did not do this. He engaged in a personal invitation. This should set up a model for us- we should seek to engage people in the message of Christ. We need to be willing to initiate engagement with those around us in order to shine the light of Christ into this world.

Second, the message of Christ is one of repentance and salvation. Zacchaeus had to acknowledge his faults and desire for Jesus to be present in his house in order to correct any wrongs to the best of his abilities. Upon doing so, Jesus declares that salvation has arrived in Zacchaeus' household. While I think the Bible makes caring for the physical needs of people an important way to serve Him, salvation remains the goal of service. Feeding physical bodies while their souls are perishing is a futile task. We can never lose sight of the vital importance that salvation plays in our dying world.

Third, we are Zacchaeus first. It is easy to think about how others need to correct their behaviors and allow Jesus into their homes while neglecting that we need to do that as well. The story of our leading others always needs to start with our being led. At some point in our lives, we too welcomed Jesus into the home of our heart. We need to allow His presence to guide and direct us so that our actions would honor Him. Just as Zacchaeus was willing to right his faults, we need to be willing to engage in that sometimes difficult process so that Jesus' words can speak into our hearts that rejoicing message of salvation. It is only after we have received this message that we can effectively proclaim the message. However, we may never take credit for the message- it must always remain in our hearts and minds that we were once the lost. Thank God we have been found and saved!

Finally, once we realize that our need for Jesus has been filled, we need to allow the message to flow from us into others. The Church should never be focused on us. It should always be focused on the lost. Once you have become a member of the family of God, you should be an active, effective member of the body of Christ. The intimacy of that relationship is what should drive us to be focused as Jesus was on seeking and saving the lost. The difference between the Sea of Galilee and the Dead Sea is stark. The Sea of Galilee is full of life and lush. Water flows in and out of it to keep it fresh and vibrant. The Dead Sea has water flow in, but it ends there. Because of that, minerals build up and nothing can live there. It is a desolate wilderness. May we receive the freshness of Christ so that He could pour out of us!





Formally known as Susquehanna Valley Pregnancy Services, Align Life Ministries has so many ways we can get involved. Some of those ways are listed below.

#### **Pregnancy Services**

- Client Advocates: As a woman or man, encourage and educate women, men and couples experiencing pregnancy. Or, as a woman, provide a pregnancy test and sit alongside a woman who isn't sure she can carry her pregnancy. (Serve weekly or biweekly for a two-to-four-hour shift. We provide training.)
- **Receptionists:** Whether scheduling appointments, making clients in the waiting room feel comfortable, or being that listening ear on the phone, a receptionist is important to the flow of the location. (Serve weekly or biweekly for a two-to-four-hour shift. We provide training.)
- **Post-Abortion Group Facilitators:** Do you have a passion to see women and men healed from the pain of abortion? Facilitate a post-abortion Bible study. Training is provided.
- **Babysitters:** Many of our clients have no one to watch their children during their Align Pregnancy Services appointment, yet to bring children into the session isn't productive to the client's learning. If you are age 18 or over and love children, you have the opportunity to be a vital part of what's happening in the lives of our clients by caring for their children at one of our locations.
- **Intercessors:** Having each location and our services bathed in prayer is crucial. Would you be available to come onsite weekly or monthly to stand in the gap with other believers on behalf of the clients we serve?
- **Baby Boutique Coordinators and Helpers:** Each of our locations has a Baby Boutique. Use your creativity to organize and stage the donations we receive. Not creative? You can sort through donations, pack diapers, and perhaps do a little washing or mending. The schedule is flexible.
- **Interpreters:** Are you bilingual? Help translate between a Client Advocate and client in individual or group sessions on an as needed basis. (Clients who have little grasp of English may be on a waiting list while we wait for God to fill this need.)
- **Lawn Care/Snow Removal/Maintenance:** We value all our volunteers, including those who are able to mow grass, plant and care for flowers, remove snow, or provide basic building maintenance.

#### **Administration**

- Office Assistant: Aid our Lebanon administrative office staff on an as needed basis with copying, mailings, computer work, and other general administrative jobs, including counting Baby Bottle Boomerang returns.
- **Church Liaisons** Connect your church family with Align Life Ministries by communicating upcoming events and important updates. Information and materials are provided.
- **Move for Life Team Leaders:** Rally friends and family to raise support with you through the Move for Life held each May. Promote the event at church, in the community, and on your social media. Tips and materials are provided.
- **Move for Life Volunteers:** Help with registration, refreshments, prizes, Kids' Zones, set up and tear down, and more. Training is provided.
- **Baby Bottle Boomerang:** Organize this fundraiser with your church, youth group, or other organization. We supply bottles and promotional tools. It's a fun and easy way for people of all ages to champion life.
