This is why I kneel before the Father. Every ethnic group in heaven or on earth is recognized by Him. I ask that He strengthen you in your inner selves from the riches of his glory through the Spirit. I ask that Christ will live in your hearts through faith. As a result of having strong roots in love, I ask that you'll have the power to grasp love's width and length, height and depth, together with all believers. I ask that you'll know the love of Christ that is beyond knowledge so that you will be filled entirely with the fullness of God.

- Ephesians 3. 14- 19 (CEB)

I love that Paul's plea for God is that we all would be able to grasp God's love even though it is beyond knowledge. How can we comprehend something that is beyond knowledge? Paul is sharing a wonderful reality for us all- God's presence is capable of doing that which is not expected. Therefore, we do not have to worry about our intellectual abilities- at some point they will fail anyway. Instead, we can lean into the Holy Spirit and feel the wonderful embrace of God's love.

This prayer is not simply for a certain group of people at a certain time. No, Paul's hope is that this is held in bond with all believers. It is vital to the unity of the body of Christ that we comprehend the love God has for us all (Colossians 3. 14). Without the greatness of this love, we will remain distracted by the world that focuses on what divides us. However, if, as the body of Christ, we become rooted in this love through the Holy Spirit, then we can be filled entirely with the fullness of God!

October is a great month to remember the unity of the Church. It starts with World Communion Sunday when Christians across the globe celebrate the unifying love of Christ that offers us all grace. We recognize that we live with different political systems, cultures, languages, and theologies, but we all stand united in the grace of Jesus Christ. And then October ends with All-Hallows Eve (colloquially called Halloween). While historians might debate the origins, the Church has used this day to start the celebration of the saints who have gone to the Church Triumphant. Both continue to implore with Paul that we could all comprehend the width and length, height and depth of God's love. Let us pursue this love together- not just in October or this year. Let this pursuit be our consistent striving throughout our life journey. In this way, we seek to make sure we are all receiving the fullness of God so that we can bring that fullness into our world all for God's glory.



HAPPY FALL Y'ALL!


As thankful as we are for the way we were able to bless the lives of so many Lebanon Co. Foster Kids, we look at our bins and realize that replenishment is upon us!

Support Ukraine Give

How is the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) responding?

UMCOR's work in Ukraine is funded with gifts to Advance #982450, International Disaster Response and Recovery. Grants for immediate relief have been given to United Methodist partners to provide direct aid inside Ukraine as well as to support those who have fled the violence. UMCOR is working through Methodist churches in neighboring nations—Poland, Hungary, Romania, Slovakia, Estonia, Bulgaria and the Czech Republic. In addition, grants are being awarded to trusted partners like ACT Alliance, International Orthodox Christian Charities (IOCC) and Human Rights League. Grants provide transportation assistance, humanitarian supplies such as food, water, clothing, shelter and medication, as well as legal services and safe spaces for families, women, children and those with disabilities. In addition, UMCOR has funded the transport of more than \$1 million in medical supplies to hospitals in Kyiv, with more supplies scheduled in the coming months. UMCOR is in continuous dialogue with UMC entities and other partners throughout Europe to identify additional ways to assist. The situation in Eastern and Central Europe is constantly evolving and with Ukraine's economic losses already estimated in the hundreds of millions of dollars, recovery efforts will take years. Global Ministries and UMCOR will continue to respond in the months and years ahead.

What prayer can I lift up for the people of Ukraine?

This intercessory prayer was written for World Day of Prayer by the women of England, Wales and Northern Ireland, on February 25, 2022:

God of the past, the present and the future,

Our thoughts and prayers are with our sisters and brothers in Ukraine and the surrounding countries in their fear and distress.

We pray too for all other regions of the world where there is conflict, unrest or oppression.

We pray that reconciliation will overcome hatred, peace will conquer war, hope will replace despair and that your plans for the region will be fulfilled,

God, in your mercy,

Hear our prayer.

Jesus desires every Christian to become more fruitful every day—neither withering away nor bearing thorns but bearing life-giving fruit.

Take note of the important distinctions the New Testament makes about each one...

Love is not easy. Real love casts out fear and picks up the hurting, suffering on the side of the road.

Joy is not manufactured. It is not a mere emotion but something that comes directly from the work of God. Having the word of God in our hearts makes it easier to *choose* joy.

Peace is not an absence of fear or anxiety. It is the feeling of wholeness when we invite God in to dwell with us.

Patience is endurance. It is more than tolerating inconveniences but *holding fast and not losing heart in the face of hard things.*

Kindness has a cost. It is a choice to do good, emerging from the power of the Holy Spirit. Biblical kindness is not benign goodwill, but humility in action *for His glory*.

Goodness overcomes evil. When we choose to be upright in our inner and outer worlds goodness flows outward to others.

Faithfulness compels us to be trustworthy. Our deep belief in God is a catalyst for us to keep commitments and be reliable in a turbulent world.

Gentleness requires awareness. We must cultivate a greater awareness of our own strength and recognize the world is more fragile than we might suspect.

Self-Control is **power**. It is not a statement of power over others, *but of oneself*. We cannot bear this on our own *but lean into the Holy Spirit to help us master our desires*.
