

"Live in me. Make your home in me just as I do in you. In the same way that a branch can't bear grapes by itself but only by being joined to the vine, you can't bear fruit unless you are joined with me.

"I am the Vine; you are the branches. When you're joined with me and I with you, the relation intimate and organic, the harvest is sure to be abundant. Separated, you can't produce a thing. Anyone who separates from me is deadwood, gathered up and thrown on the bonfire. But if you make yourselves at home with me and my words are at home in you, you can be sure that whatever you ask will be listened to and acted upon.

This is how my Father shows who he is—when you produce grapes, when you mature as my disciples.

-John 15. 4- 8 (The Message)

I have been thinking a lot about how intricate life is connected. In a society that tends to stress individualism, we sometimes forget how truly connected we are and are designed to be. Even as individuals, we are the result of DNA that has been passed down from generation to generation in order to create us as we are. As a society, we need people to fill different roles in order to thrive. We need people to grow food, people to haul items, people to create and distribute electricity, people who manage waste- the list is endless! If any of those jobs go unfulfilled, then the whole of society would suffer. So why do we lose this understanding so quickly? Why is it so easy to see some as more important than others? Have we lost our profound sense of connection?

The Ecclesia (Church) is frequently described as the "body of Christ (Romans 12, 1 Corinthians 12)." This is Paul's effort to remind people how connected we are called to be. It is a tangible description. The body is most effective when all parts are fully operational. Most of us have experienced when a part of our body failed. In those moments, we understand how fundamentally interconnected the body is. The Ecclesia is called to be so connected! So, if we know that the Bible clearly tells us that this should be, why is it so hard? Are our theological differences, different interpretations of Scripture, different political ideologies, or even different personalities stronger than the grace and love of Christ. I would argue they should not be!

In the 15th chapter of John, Jesus tells His disciples that they need to be connected to Him. I would be willing to bet when you read those verses, you read them as you as an individual. It is not. The you (as it is in most of the New Testament) is plural. Read it again from that perspective. We need to be connected to Jesus. In that connection, we will bear fruit. Apart from that connection, we can do nothing. It is a powerful reminder that we are not in this spiritual battle alone. We are joined intricately together and intricately with Christ. If we allow anything to break that connection, then we have failed! This year, I am trying something new. The whole year we will be looking at our interconnectedness. My hope and prayer is that we will use this year to reestablish our connections to the vine and to each other. I have no doubt that if we find those connections, we will bear much fruit- not because of our individuality, but because of God's presence within our Ecclesia. May God's Holy Spirit divinely weave a beautiful tapestry



Nothing electronic that needs batteries please.


Baby wipes and tissues.


Napkins, paper plates etc. since everyone brings food!
