Where is your sting, Death?


(Death's sting is sin, and the power of sin is the Law.) Thanks be to God, who gives us this victory through our Lord Jesus Christ!

I have been told that I am a good loser and a terrible winner. Guilty. I enjoy games and I enjoy winning. I think having a positive attitude about games is important. At Day Camp, I told the children at my table that we were going to win Bingo. One child said he isn't very good. Another said that they never win prizes. I said to them if you sit with me, you are a winner! They laughed and we anxiously listened for letters and numbers and marked our cards. As we got closer and closer, the excitement built. I made sure we all knew what numbers would win for us. And then we won! They were so excited (and so was I) I was informed that I am good at Bingo- I didn't have the heart to tell them it is complete luck, we simply rejoiced together.

I think all Christians should have the mentality that we are winners- because we are! In most games like Bingo and cards, the outcome is unknown before the game begins. This gives the game a measure of excitement as you watch and wonder what the outcome is going to be. For Christians, we know how this game ends! I do not need to hope for a measure of "luck" or that I will play my cards right. I do not need to worry about making mistakes or being perfect. Instead, I simply rejoice in the victory that was won so long ago even though the struggles in this life remain. As a matter of fact, I think knowing we have the victory should change how we view the struggles. We should enter all of them with the confidence and joy that comes with knowing that we have the victory! Our positive attitude should not be about confidence in ourselves or our abilities, but in the one who has given us the victory!

The Christian artist TobyMac has a song called "Promised Land" that I love. He lost his son to an overdose and considered that he would not write songs again. Then came this one. It recognizes the struggles that we face in life - in his case a struggle I hope none of us ever has to fight. As he wonders about the Promised Land, he concludes that the Promise Land isn't a place, it is Jesus. I love this



conclusion. Anything I experience or hope for in this life is frail. I can lose here. I will lose here. My Promise Land isn't about this place, but about the victory that Jesus has already won. In that victory, I can rejoice even in the difficult moments. So let us all embrace this Gospel Truth- you have been given victory through Jesus Christ! His death on the cross has assured it! So, rejoice, good Christian friends, in the victory! And let us share that victory with all those around us in the hopes that they too will know the power and blessings of Jesus Christ!


