I think the Christian faith is scandalous. The idea that God would be willing to sacrifice His Son

should astonish us. The very concept that Jesus was chosen before the Creation of the world should make us wonder about the greatness of God's wisdom. Even before the fall of humanity from God's presence, God knew they would need a Savior. He didn't hesitate to create even though God knew that there would be problems. Instead, God had a plan that was greater than our faults. His plan was to descend into the very creation that had failed! The Creator became the Created! Perhaps this is the most scandalous concept within our faith.

Christmas tends to focus a lot on very worldly concepts. We can deny it all we want, but gifts and consumerism dominate our culture and even our own experiences in December. If we removed that part of the season, it wouldn't even feel like Christmas- even though we have multiple movies and books to try to change that perspective. We love the lights, the music, even the smells of the season! Hallmark has made a whole industry of the romanticism of the season! The sweet image of a newborn child and a doting mother and father (or as one of our children said "stepfather") are in our homes, stores, towns, altar tables, etc. In the midst of it all, it is easy to miss the scandal of the season, but it is this scandal that really has changed history and our lives.

God became flesh. The very author of life became a part of life. It truly is hard to comprehend! How can the all-powerful become the powerless? Why would God risk it all for a creation that had, and frequently still is, rejecting Him? God is love (1 John 4. 8). This is the grand explanation. Love is willing to take risks to enable the people around them. God's love was so great that He created knowing that creation would rebel. He created knowing that the solution would cost Him dearly. All this was done for you! God's love for you was so great that this grand and glorious plan went into action. This is why faith is not about us, but simply our trust in the one who set it all in motion.

So Christmas has become a season of great joy and gift giving for a reason. It is all in celebration of God's amazing love and grace. As we go through this season of gift giving, song singing, family gatherings and traditions, may we always remember that it is all because of the great gift of God's own presence taking human form. Jesus lived so that we could be set free from this world and enter into God's Kingdom. We could not be liberated by perishable things-so God did what seems impossible. Let us thank God with our lives throughout this season by putting our faith and hope in Jesus Christ.
