
Good News in Ono JANUARY 2024





For my part, I am going to boast about nothing but the Cross of our Master, Jesus Christ. Because of that Cross, I have been crucified in relation to the world, set free from the stifling atmosphere of pleasing others and fitting into the little patterns that they dictate. Can't you see the central issue in all this? It is not what you and I do—submit to circumcision, reject circumcision. It is what God is doing, and he is creating something totally new, a free life! All who walk by this standard are the true Israel of God—his chosen people. Peace and mercy on them!

-Galatians 6. 14- 16 (The Message)

I think I really enjoyed starting new schools. When I left Downingtown to attend West Virginia University, I no

longer had to be Robb the sixth of the Faller kids. Everything about my life was wide open- new friends, new places, new opportunities. I was surrounded by people who had spoken faith to me and that empowered me to make better choices. Faith, which I struggled with as a teen, became suddenly easy. It was such a powerful reality to see that God was creating a new life in me! I look back on that time with great joy at knowing what a great gift God had provided for me.

Every year society celebrates a New Year as a new opportunity to change life. New Year equals new opportunities. However, most recent research indicates less than 9% of people complete their New Year's resolution! If somebody asked me to try something with a 91% failure rate, I wouldn't even try. Regardless, each year the same thing happens. People make commitments and people fail. So why do we do this? Is there something within us that recognizes the need to be better? And if we all want to be better, then why are we so terrible at it?

Christianity has long held fast to the idea that change does not come from within ourselves. We are fragile. We are insufficient. Try as we may at doing better, our selfish natures struggle to truly do better. The gospel message, however, is that it is not about you! Paul reminds the Galatians that what really matters is what God is doing. What is God doing? He is making a new creation out of everyone who follows Him! Your job is to simply allow God to work- to yield to His presence in your life. This is not what the independent world wants to believe or operate with, but it is how God has been working for over 2000 years now! This year, simply yield your life to Him and watch God work!

Paul uses this idea to remind us of where our "boasting" is established. It cannot be in our own abilities but must rest in the presence of Jesus Christ. I know that I cannot be perfect myself, but that the Cross of Christ brings about that perfection. This is a freeing and wonderful idea- we are perfect because of Him. I have, do and will fail. Sometimes it is tempting to allow those times to define me. Alleluia, the victory belongs to Jesus! So let us boast in Him this year!
