

If we simply were capable of responding consistently with love, then the world would be a much better place. Unfortunately, we continue to be under our negative impulsive behavior. So how is this "good" news? The good news is that God understands our blight and has developed a solution.

That solution begins with Jesus dying on the cross for the faults of the world. No longer do we need to worry that the failures of the past will destroy the possibilities of the future. The faults of the world have been paid for by the mercy of Jesus Christ. I love how this is seen as the kindness and love of God. I love that it is fully God's capabilitywe cannot do anything to help, nor can we do anything to hinder! Jesus fully paid the price and simply offered that for us all. However, just because salvation was purchased, it does not mean that we are no longer connected with our old selves. Our nature remains and we continue to struggle to make Godly choices. The good news isn't finished.

The Holy Spirit is God's presence within us. Recognizing that we need an internal makeover in order to be set free from our old nature. This presence is not merely trickled into our lives, God pours it into us fully! God doesn't do things half-way. He didn't half-way deal with sin, nor does He simply half-way deal with the Holy Spirit. This Pentecost we will celebrate as a unified body of Christ once again. As we do so, may we be reminded of our need for the Holy Spirit to be poured into our lives. May we willingly accept that presence in our lives so that we can be transformed-pulled away from our old nature and into our new nature as God's Holy and beloved children! We celebrate with Christians all over the world as we remember the great news of Jesus Christ, the love of the Father and the presence of the Holy Spirit.






