



For we are God's co-workers; you are God's field, God's building. Using the grace God gave me, I laid a foundation, like a skilled master-builder; and another man is building on it. But let each one be careful how he builds. For no one can lay any foundation other than the one already laid, which is Yeshua the Messiah. Some will use gold, silver or precious stones in building on this foundation; while others will use wood, grass or straw. But each one's work will be shown for what it is; the Day will disclose it, because it will be revealed by fire — the fire will test the quality of each one's work. If the work someone has built on the foundation survives, he will receive a reward; if it is burned up, he will have to bear the loss: he will

still escape with his life but it will be like escaping through a fire.

1 Corinthians 3. 9-15 (CJB)

My first confirmation class was a memorable one. We had a large church and a large group, but what I remember most was the extreme commitment from a handful of them. I was certain in our conversations that they would become the future leaders of the church. One of them would be ordained in the Assemblies of God denomination. He and his wife were dedicated to worship and leading others in worship. He spoke with such great and powerful conviction. Witnessing him develop into a leader in the church made my heart feel full. Any part I had in God directing him down this path seemed like a great gift.

A few years ago, I noticed a change. He seemed to be struggling. Before I knew it, he had left his church and his family moved to Florida where he could begin a career as a school teacher. My heart broke. What happened? He became very vocal in his disbelief. I would say he went so far as becoming an anti-evangelist. My heart broke more. I still remember the fervor of his faith as a youth. I even found his last sermon on-line. He spoke with great conviction. I would have never guessed that he was floundering to believe the words that sprung from his mouth. As I was pondering this driving down the road, I felt God leading me to our summer sermon series.

Constructing our faith is important. Like anything that is valuable, it does not simply happen. You need to commit time, effort and resources to build faith. The most fundamental part of any building is the foundation. If the foundation is not firm, then no matter how great the building may seem, it is at risk. So, as with any building, let us make sure our foundation is in Jesus Christ. He is our unshakeable foundation. I feel like Dee and I have been through some exceptionally difficult situations. Through it all it was Jesus who kept us firm. It was not our faith, our wisdom, or any abilities we brought. There have been times when all of those have been shaken. But Jesus remains our steadfast foundation. As we commit to a "Summer of Construction" may we never forget who our foundation is.

That being said, help me construct the sermon series. What has helped build your faith? How did things build your faith? What struggles have you gone through that reshaped your faith? I often remind myself that Scripture talks about us, not simply me. So when it says you are God's building, it is a plural you. So let us build this series together. Call me, text me, email me, however you want. I would value your input as we allow God to transform us into His Holy Temple.



At its May 28th meeting, Ad Council decided to advertise to the congregation the creation of a committee whose main task would be to organize the beginning of a discernment process at Ono about Ono's future. I will lead this group as Lay Leader. The 2 most immediate actions of this group will be to: 1) organize a presentation to the congregation about what happened at the UMC 2024 General Conference, and 2) host a congregational meeting at which time this presentation will be given. 
