A friend of mine has been challenging me on saying that Open Arms (a church Dee and I planted and they attended) failed because I am a terrible fundraiser. It's true though. I have done a lot of financial leadership training and understand well things that help increase giving. I actually put a lot of those things in practice. I understand that people tend to give to causes which is why we stress all the ministries that happen at Ono. I want people to realize that their giving makes a difference in this world. We have programs to lead our children, youth and adults into faithful relationships with Jesus. We serve the community with support for food programs and clothing programs. We recently hosted the Lebanon County Firefighters memorial service. All these things are done so that we can be the light of Christ in Northern Lebanon and I feel privileged to be a part of this faithfulness. So why am I so bad at fundraising...

The experts remind me that you have to ask. When churches do building campaigns, someone has to ask for the money. Some pastors are great at this. My theology gets in my own way. I believe we should simply give out of what God has given to us. The prophet Malachi even provides this promise that if the people give faithfully, God's provisions will be abundant! My unpopular opinion is that

greed is the biggest detractor in our country than any other sin issue. My support for this- the average American donates 1.7% of their disposable income to charity. For Christians, that number goes to 2.5%. My heart aches at those numbers. Why do we struggle to give more?

Personally, I started tithing when I became a Christian. It was super easy because I made almost no money. However, I noticed that anytime I needed something, God seemed to provide. In college I needed a hundred dollars to pay a bill. I finally concluded I would need to ask my parents. I got home to make the call and there was a letter in the mail from WVU. Any student who was in the Honors program and had no other scholarships had a check for \$125 waiting for them! I ran to that office, paid my bill, gave \$15 to the church and then took my roommate to Taco Bell! Simpler times. Eventually, Dee and I started at Jarrettown and money was tight, but we did whatever we had to do and tithed on our housing allowance and salary because that's what we believed was right. God was faithful and we never went hungry. Eventually, I decided to break our tithe down to the first ten months so that when Christmas came we would have extra money. November came and I realized we were still in good shape. God is faithful so I wrote the same checks for November and December and have been over tithing ever since.

I never want anyone to feel bad, guilty or anything because of their giving habits. I simply want to encourage people to be faithful and trust that God will lead you. Part of that faithfulness is me reminding you the Bible asks you to trust God through your tithes. For some of us, it is less challenging than for others. For all of us, this promise remains: God will pour out a blessing that goes beyond your needs! Let us trust God's provisions together!
