For if we were reconciled with God through his Son's death when we were enemies. how much more will we be delivered by his life, now that we are reconciled! And not only will we be delivered in the future, but we are boasting about God right now, because he has acted through our Lord Yeshua the Messiah, through whom we have already received that reconciliation.

-Romans 5. 6- 11


At Mt. Tabor UMC they read a prayer of confession followed by this statement: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us. This proves God's love for us! In the name of Jesus Christ, you are forgiven! Every single week it gave me goosebumps. No matter how often I hear it, I am flabbergasted that God would look at humanity and decide that we were worth saving- especially as we so consistently rebel against Him. Who would do that? Who looks at their "enemy" and says I am going to help you? Nobody. Certainly not anybody I have ever met. That is why the gospel is so counter cultural! God does what humanity does not! He loves unconditionally! He offers a solution to problems created by others! He sacrifices for those who are not willing to sacrifice for Him. I stand in awe of His grace. I rest in peace because He chose to fix my failures so that I may experience Him!

How does this impact my life? Two things: first, it allows me to follow God. It's all about grace- without

it, I would still be against Him. Glory be to God alone because He is the only reason that we can be connected to Him. We cannot take credit for anything. Second, it helps me seek to love all people- even those who want to be my enemies. Why? Because my hope remains that I become more God-like. And God loved His enemies with the desire that they would become friends- in other words, reconciled. From my perspective, I count nobody as my enemy. They might be against me, but I want to be for everyone. Reconciliation is our ministry and our calling! We, the Church, as the Body of Christ are called to be in this ministry to seek to draw all people into God's presence.

This fall I am going to do something I haven't done in awhile. We are going to walk through Romans on Sunday mornings. The Book of Romans is probably the book of the Bible that has impacted the theology of the Church the most. As Paul wrote it, I doubt he had any idea of the impact it would have in history, but God spoke mightily through him. Above all things. Romans reminds us of this simple truth- it is all about the grace of God. We are a broken people who need to be made whole. Thanks be to God that He saw our brokenness and did what we could not do! He restored us to His presence! He reconciled our relationship to Him. I trust that when we are finished going through Romans, that God's grace will help us to draw closer to Him so that we will glorify Him in everything we do! I look forward to this journey with you!

We had such a great time hanging out every Monday morning this August! Making crafts, playing games (UNO!), talking about and learning that Jesus asks us to pray without ceasing!








Our Youth start each month of in the prayer room as Jess Grimes leads them deeper into an intentional prayer life.

Sending the Gospel to the Ends of the Earth

Four years ago, a 9-year-old girl in the Middle East received a shoebox gift, complete with items that quickly became her favorites: a stuffed bird and The Greatest Gift Gospel storybook. God stirred her heart as she read the stories, and she soon enrolled in discipleship classes through her church.

"After hearing the story of the cross and how Jesus died for me, I gave my life to Christ," she said. "I trusted Him fully."

Recently, she gathered 13 of her friends on the street and began teaching them the discipleship lessons she had learned. As a result, six of these boys and girls accepted Christ as their Lord and Savior.

When the girl's family moved a couple streets away, she started a second discipleship group with 13 new boys and girls. This time, five others came to faith.

Through one shoebox gift, a dozen children are now sharing Christ with others!

Reaching young evangelists like these sometimes means sending shoeboxes through <u>Build a Shoebox</u> <u>Online</u>. These shoebox gifts are packed with special care to avoid cultural, religious, or customs challenges. Over 25 hard-to-reach countries have received shoeboxes built online.

Accomplish in themselves the promise of all you've given. Give them a desire for truth and passion for real learning. Have them learn to give, to love, to forgive and encourage.


Stay by their sides and light up their souls.
Fill them, guide them, protect them and enliven them.


